7.30 p.m. SATURDAY 13th January

HIDDEN FIGURES (PG) (120 mins)

Set in the 1960s, this is an inspirational and yet, until now, little known story of three African-American women who played a significant part in the NASA space race programme and the successful launch of John Glen into space. Thought-provoking but with a lovely sense of humour. With the support of an excellent performance by Kevin Kostner.

2.30 p.m. TUESDAY 23rd January

A STREET CAT NAMED BOB (12) (100 mins)

This is the heart-warming story of a stray ginger tomcat ("Bob") who 'adopts' and helps transform the life of James Bowen, a London street busker and recovering drug addict. A film that helps to restore faith in human kindness

7.30 p.m. SATURDAY 10th February

DENIAL (12) (105 mins)

The fascinating account of Deborah E. Lipstadt's (Rachel Weiss) legal battle for historical truth. When Holocaust denier, David Irving (Timothy Spall) accused Lipstadt of defamation, she determined to prove, in the English court, that the Holocaust had actually happened.

2.30 p.m. TUESDAY 27th February

BELLE (12) (99 mins)

Directed by Amma Asante (A United Kingdom) this "exquisite masterpiece" relates the true story of an 18th century mixed-race English woman who, although raised in privilege by her aristocratic great-uncle, faces a huge struggle to gain true acceptance within her family and society at large. Filmed on the Isle of Man.

7.30 p.m. SATURDAY 10th March

FREEDOM WRITERS (12) (120 mins)

The story of disenchanted, inner-city school kids in America who appear 'unteachable', that is until real-life teacher, Erin Gruwell, takes on the challenge of changing their perceptions on life. Hilary Swank is superb as the teacher who is determined to give disadvantaged young people a voice.

2.30 p.m. TUESDAY 27th March

POPULAIRE (12) (106 mins)

A funny, frivolous, colourful and charming French film starring competitive typists (and typewriters!). The story begins in 1958 when Rose Pamphyle, who lives in a sleepy French village, decides she wants more from life and decides to apply for a job as a secretary in the town of Lisieux.
