

The extraordinary story of Queen Victoria and her unlikely but devoted friendship with a young Indian clerk, Abdul Karim, who had travelled from India in 1887 to participate in the Queen's *Golden Jubilee*. Victoria defies both the stifling constrictions of her royal role and her household's bitter disapproval of the "Munshi". Starring Judi Dench & directed by Stephen Frears.

However, the peace and fulfilment he seeks is sorely challenged by the only person willing to join him, his former friend Katz, who proves a challenge in himself! Robert Redford and Nick Nolte star in this very enjoyably amusing film.
