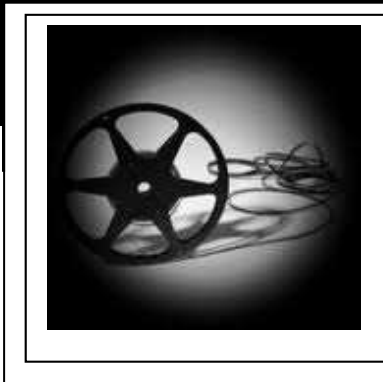

**THE POST (12) (111 mins)**

Tells the true story of a cover-up that spanned four US presidents and pushed the first ever female newspaper publisher, Katherine Graham (Meryl Streep) and her determined editor, Ben Bradlee (Tom Hanks) to wage an unprecedented battle between the press and the Government. (Directed by Steven Spielberg)

**2.30 p.m. TUESDAY 22nd January**

**SEVE, THE MOVIE (PG) (119 mins)**

No interest in golf is required to fully enjoy this fascinating story of golfing legend, Seve Ballesteros who, from a humble background, fought with huge determination to become the most spectacular and charismatic golfer of his generation.
