The Lost King (12) (1 hr 48mins)

In 2012, having been lost for over 500 years, the remains of King Richard III were discovered beneath a carpark in Leicester. The search had been orchestrated by an amateur historian, Philippa Langley, whose unrelenting research had been met with incomprehension by her friends and family and with scepticism by experts and academics. THE LOST KING is the life-affirming true story of a woman who refused to be ignored and who took on the country's most eminent historians, forcing them to think again about one of the most controversial kings in England's history.

2.30 p.m. TUESDAY 24th October

Save the Cinema (12) (2 hrs)

The true story of how small Welsh community in Camarthan banded together and enlisted the help of Hollywood filmmaker Steven Spielberg to save their listed art deco cinema (which also doubles as the home for the local youth theatre) from shifty developers who want to pull it down and build a mall. With a heart warming tone, this Welsh comedy-drama recounts a true story about a woman taking on a corrupt system.

7.30 p.m. SATURDAY 121h November

"Evelyn" (12) (1hr 30mins)

Based on true events, "Evelyn" tells the inspiring story of real life hero Desmond Doyle (Pierce Brosnan) and his young children. Abandoned by his wife Doyle does his best raising his kids alone in Ireland. When his wife's mother reports her daughter's abandonment to the authorities the power of the Church and the Irish courts take them away to an orphanage. This story tells how they challenge the law before the Irish Supreme Court and the uplifting testament to the strength of the Father's love and the power of the human Spirit.

2.30 p.m. TUESDAY 28th November

A Bunch of Amateurs (15) (1hr. 36mins)

Jefferson Steel (Burt Reynolds) is an aging Hollywood action hero. He's vain, insecure and out if work. In an attempt to find Jefferson work his incompetent agent stumbles upon the perfect role playing King Lear at Stratford on Avon...... but things don't work quite as he anticipated!
